Who is the TABCCM President?

Franklin (Frank) Moss was elected president of the Texas Association of Black City Council Members in Fort Worth, Texas on October 21, 2009. Frank comes to this office with a great deal of enthusiasm and commitment to the TABCCM.

He was elected in August 1998 to fill the Fort Worth District 5 slot that was vacated with the death of Eugene McCray. Frank was re-elected for 3 additional terms but resigned from the council to run for County Commissioner in January 2004. He was not successful in his bid for the County Commissioner post, he was re-elected to the Fort Worth City Council in June 2007.

Frank has been active with the TABCCM since his election in August 1998. He has served as Program Committee Chair, and was Vice President of TABCCM when he left office in 2004. He has been a member of Texas Municipal League, National League of

when he left office in 2004. He has been a member of Texas Municipal League, National League Cities, and the National Black Caucus of Local Elected Officials (NBC-LEO).

Frank holds a B.S. Degree from Texas Wesleyan College and a Masters in Urban Affairs from University of Texas at Arlington. He has had advanced studies at University of Texas at Arlington, and Harvard University- John Fitzgerald Kennedy School of Government.

Frank knows the importance of hard work because he worked full time to send himself through college. The jobs he held provided him an opportunity to complete his education and secure his B.A. and Master Degrees.

His employment after college included working at a youth service agency, Planner with the City of Mansfield, Tarrant County, and later as a Senior Manpower Planner at the North Central Texas Council of Government. He later was promoted to manager of the Regional Manpower Planning section at NCTCOG. He was employed 13 years as the Executive Director of the Fort Worth Economic Development Corporation. In 1993, he opened his current business, Moss Real Estate and Development Group. Frank is a Licensed Texas Real Estate Broker.

He has been active across the community. He serves as a board member and Treasurer of the Fort Worth/Tarrant County Chapter of the NAACP, Charter Member of the Tarrant County Black Historical and Genealogical Society and serves as a Deacon at Ebenezer Missionary Baptist Church. He is a past board member and the first Black President of the University of Texas at Arlington Alumni Association. He is a charter member and President of the Center for Stop Six Heritage, Inc.

Some of the recognition he is most proud of are: UTA Alumni Association Distinguished Alumni Service Award 1997, UTA School of Urban and Public Affairs Distinguished Alumni Award 1999, and Texas Wesleyan University Alumni Association Alumnus of the Year 2000. He also received the National Association of Development Corporation Organization Region VI Hall of Fame Award-"Advocate for Community Development" 1993.

Frank is married to Christene Chadwick Moss and they have three children.

The 2010 U.S. Census

The 2010 Census is upon us and this is one of the most important census to date. As we know the census is a count of everyone residing in the United States. All U.S. residents must be counted – both citizens and non citizens. This is the shortest census form in history. The 2010 Census form asks 10 questions and takes about 10 minutes to complete. Questionnaires will be sent out in March 2010 either by U.S. mail or hand delivery. Why is it important that as council members you get involved and make sure the community completes their form? Because the census data determines the number of seats each state will have in the U.S. Senate and U.S. House of Representative. In addition, the census will affect the number and allocation of Texas Senate and Texas House Members seats in the Texas Legislature. The data will also help determine the allocation of federal funds (every year over \$300 billion is awarded) for community services, such as school lunch programs and senior citizen centers and new construction, such as schools, highways and hospitals. On the local level the census will affect redistricting of cities especially districts that have large areas of low count. It is important that we as black elected officials get involved and get our communities counted for continued representation because in March 2011 the Census Bureau will be completing it's delivery of redistricting data to states. Please encourage your constituents to complete and mail back the form. If we can't represent the community, then who will? If you need more information or need to find out who is the census representative for your area, please contact Gabriel Perales of the U.S. Census Bureau at 214.637.9680 (office), 214.793.1656 (cell) or e-mail: Gabriel.perales@census.gov. The U.S. Census Bureau has begun hiring people to assist in the 2010 U.S. Census. They are interested in hiring people familiar with their communities. If you know someone who is interested in employment, have them call 1-866-861-2010 for more information.
